

Consulting for Change

<u>Encouraging Women Across All Borders</u> (EWAAB) is developing the next generation of young women and non-binary folks, producing confident and capable professionals ready to take on new challenges. Through our year-long mentorship program students develop crucial problem solving, critical thinking and presentation skills all while exploring various future career paths. We strive to provide ample opportunities for our students to put their skills into practice because nothing can compare to solving real-world problems.

We have seen firsthand the growth of the consulting industry as more and more of our students consider careers in that industry. As these students prepare to enter this field we have noticed two key issues - first, many students don't have a real understanding of what consultants do and how to prepare for success and second, it is still a male-dominated industry despite some efforts from a few organizations.

To address these issues we are developing **Consulting for Change**, a month-long consulting challenge for rising sophomore and junior undergraduate students interested in the field. In this challenge students will be asked to *research*, *analyze* and *propose* a solution to a problem posed by one of our partner nonprofits. Student groups will be paired with an industry mentor and be required to attend weekly "lunch and learn" talks to aid their experiential learning. At the end of the month student groups will be tasked with presenting their proposal to the nonprofit and an industry advisory committee to provide constructive feedback.
